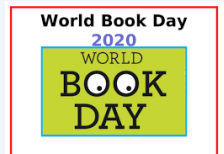
World Book Day - visiting authors

Dear Lynda ...

I have received a letter from someone at the Education Welfare Service telling me my child's attendance is low. What do I do next?

The Local Authority's Education Welfare Officer will continue to monitor your child's attendance. If she sees no improvement it is likely she will ask to meet with you at school. You can be placed on a Parent Contract or even fast-tracked into court if there are significant concerns about your child's attendance. You will have received letters of concern from school prior to this and an offer of support by me. If you feel I can be of help, please let me know and I would be only too willing to help with any issues which prevent you from getting your child to school regularly.
